Description

Smith with their initials to lower turn in, raised bands, spine in six panels, title and author lettered directly to first panel, publisher and date to footSpine very slightly faded, internally some off setting from leather turn ins on to endpapers, otherwise quite bright and cleanHoused in a lined, leather entry slipcase. One of one hundred and eighty paper copies (with another twelve on vellum), "printed in double column on Batchelor paper of a larger size than any hitherto used, bearing the Knight in Armour water-mark.
