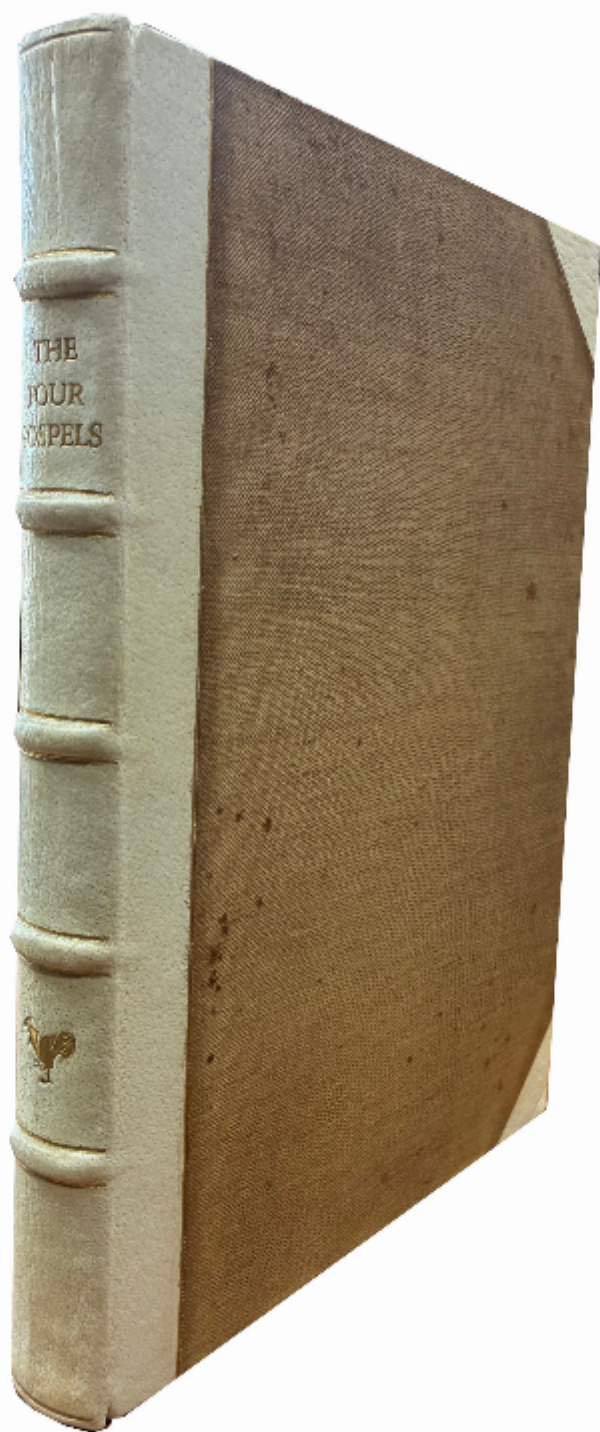

Original half pigskin and buckram over boards by Sangorski and Sutcliffe, raised bands, spine in six panels, title in gilt to second panel, cockerel device to fifth, t.e.g., remainder untrimmed Spine very slightly rubbed, usual light foxing to cloth covers, internally bright and clean, and signed by Eric Gill to title ('Eric G', within a small illustration of a ball and chain attached to the foot of the cockerel vignette on the title page) Number three hundred and seventy-two of five hundred copies on paper (with another twelve on vellum).
